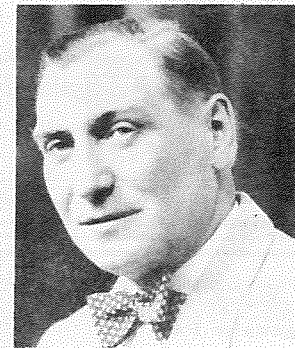

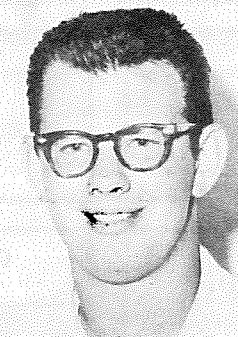

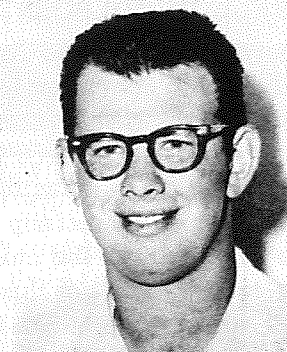

I congratulate executive officers for the great work they are doing

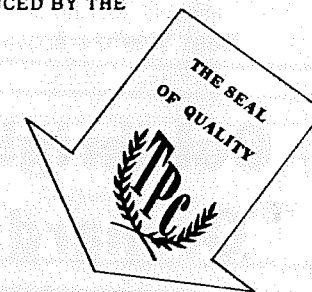

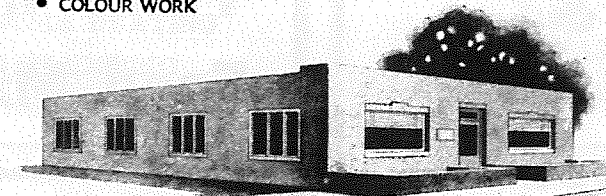

GRAFTON BOYS BASEBALL

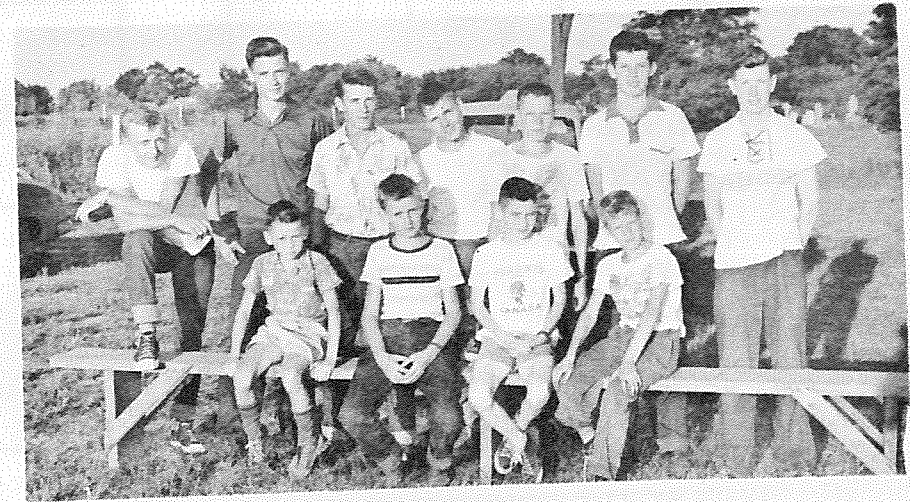

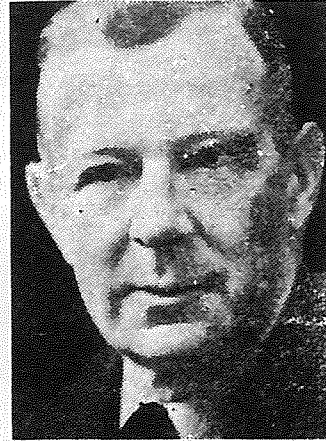

ARMLESS BOY PITCHES FOR TEAM

Lexington, Va. — A junior at Lylburn Downing High School here plays the bass drum in the band, kicks extra points for the football team, pitches and takes part in other sports.

That's nothing unusual for an active high school boy—except that Lewis Watts has no arms.

Lewis, 18, doesn't excel in athletics alone. His principal, U. B. Broadneaux, says he is one of the higher-standing pupils scholastically in his class.

The boy, who wants to make music his career, was born without arms. He has "never felt sorry" for himself, Lewis says—determining to live a life as near normal as possible.

His legs and feet have been trained to perform the many tasks necessary to daily living.

He "pitches" occasionally for his Junior League team, the Wildcats, grasping the ball with his right foot and hurling at the batter. Last summer, he missed a shutout by just one run.

The previous summer, he pitched two no-hit games in Junior League play.

When "pitching" softball, he must ease the toes on his right foot under the ball, balance it on top of his toes and whip it forward.

Since he cannot hold a bat, when he comes to the plate the ball is rolled along the ground and he "hits" it with his foot. A speedy runner, he has beaten out many a kicked roller for a base hit.
