

Ghosts of course, but the glorious trail of glory blazed by the Cobourg team was actually begun in the year 1937.

It was in 1937 that the name Galloping Ghosts came into being; born the result of two years of trial and tribulation on the part of the then called Cobourg "Red Raiders".

Since formation in 1935 the Red Raiders had suffered through two years of nothing but trouble, both of a financial and playing nature. Gates in those days seldom topped the \$35 mark and victories were even harder to come by for it wasn't until the final game of 1937, following 12 consecutive losses that the team finally managed to win a game.

Deciding something had to be done to remedy a painful situa-

tion before a new season rolled around. Fred Dufton, President and Manager of the team, huddled one Sunday afternoon in the Dufton living room with the then club Treasurer, Johnny Hayden.

Something was done alright. They began with changing the name. Johnny suggested the move, expressing his conviction that a complete housecleaning was in order. A turning over of a new leaf, so to speak. The name Galloping Ghosts was also a Hayden brainchild and its popularity was instantaneous, as it proved to be a good luck omen.

Not only was a new name added but colour combinations were revised, retaining red and white but changing white to the predominent hue, just as it remains at the present time.

WHAT ABOUT THE "T FORMATION"

Volumes have been written on the subject T formation football. However we feel that the readers of this programme in general, will not be interested in a complicated discussion of the T. What people want to know, is its difference from the system they have been watching for years. This has been either single or double wing formation or variations of these.

The T is not really a new method of attack. It was used several years ago, both in Canada and the U. S. A. However it is only quite recently that it has come into universal usage.

In single wing play the ball is delivered to the backfielder by a direct snap from centre. As the ball travels thru the air away from the line of scrimmage, not only is it visible to the opposition but it must be carried back up to the line. Both of these operations take time and tend to give the play away. This means that lines have to hold their blocks longer to keep the hole open.

When the T formation is used the ball is merely handed from the centre to the quarter who stands immediately behind him and who when he receives the ball, pivots, thus hiding the ball from the opposition at once. What a good T quarterback does with the ball from here, makes the difference. He may hand off to a player going thru the line, take a hand off and shovel pass to a back going wide, or fade back to pass.

In any case he continues to go thru the same motions even after he has given up the ball, and if the taking has been good, the defensive side will not know until too late who's got the button.







- 8. Pushing Hands Forward from Shoulders with Hands Vertical—Illegal Interference.
- 9. Both Arms Straight Out from Body—Forward Pass touched or caught by Ineligible Receiver.
- 10. Both Arms Extended Above Head—A score. (Bringing hands together indicates a "safety-touch" score.)





A Summary of the More Common Penalties

- ROUGH PLAY—Deliberately charging the ball carrier, striking or kicking an opponent, using abusive language. Penalty: 15 yards by offending side; serious offense, disqualification and 25 yards.
- OFFSIDE—A player on either team is offside if he
 is ahead of the line of scrimmage when the ball
 is snapped. Penalty: for team in possession of
 ball, loss of one down or 10 yards on the third
 down; for defending team, five yards.
- HOLDING—The illegal use of hands and arms. Penalty: 10 yards, plus loss of down if incurred by team in possession of the ball.
- 4. BALL ILLEGALLY PUT INTO PLAY—When an insufficient number of attacking players are within one yard of the line of scrimmage when the ball is put into play. Penalty: loss of down.
- OFFSIDE PASS—A lateral pass thrown forward. Penalty: Loss of down.
- 6. AN ILLEGALLY-THROWN FORWARD PASS— Penalty: Loss of down.
- 7. "NO YARDS" ON A KICKED BALL—Any player who was not behind the ball when it was kicked must be at least five yards away from an opponent who is attempting to receive the kicked ball. Penalty to offending team: 15 yards.
- 8. ILLEGAL INTERFERENCE—An attempt by players of the attacking team to block opponents outside of the prescribed limits—"clipping" or blocking an opponent from behind. Penalty: Loss of down and 10 yards. (Clipping, 15 yards.)
- FORWARD PASS TOUCHED OR CAUGHT BY AN INELIGIBLE RECEIVER— Penalty: Loss of down.


