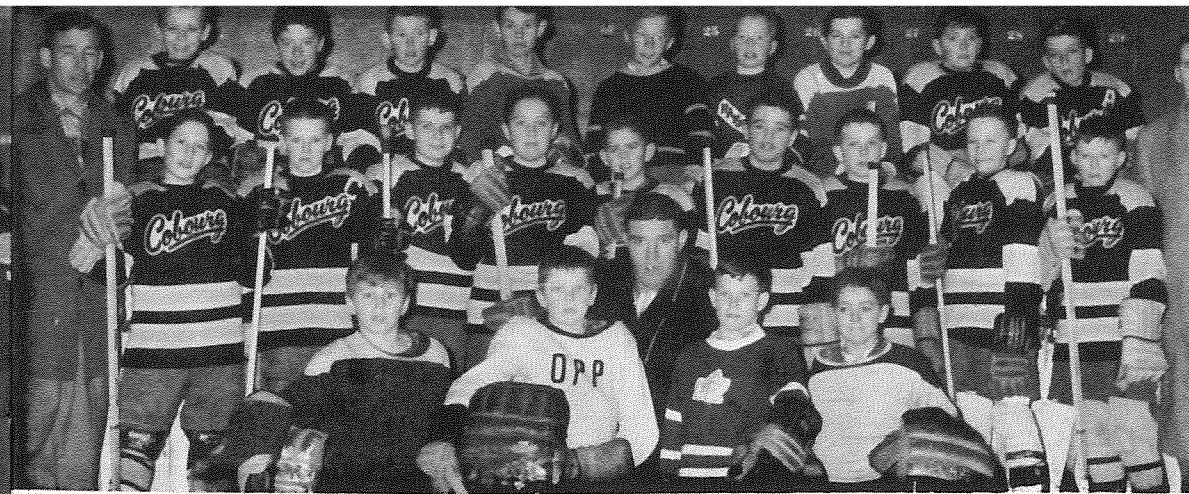

Les Rocket

Now, after 18 seasons, Father Time has caught up with Maurice his retirement signalling the end of the most successful era in Canadiens' history.

A man of extravagant deeds and outlandish drama, the Rocket ranks indeed as Hockey's player of the half century, an honour accorded him a few years ago by sports writers in a nationwide poll conducted by The Canadien Press.

The Rocket, off the ice, has been a fine, upstanding citizen, contributing in his own quiet way a great deal to the community from which he draws adulation.

When Maurice bagged his 400th goal the Canadiens presented him with two cheques, totalling \$2,000. Accepting gracefully from managing director Frank J. Selke at centre ice, Richard took the microphone.

"I wish to thank the management for these cheques," he said. "I wish to thank the fans for their support. As a mark of my own appreciation, I am going to donate this money to St. Justine's Hospital for Children and to the Montreal Childrens Hospital. I hope this money may help to make some child well again. Through it some crippled boy may some day know the joy of skating, perhaps the thrill of playing hockey."

At this time it might be well to recall the Rocket's greatest goal, the one he scored while semi-conscious against the Boston Bruins on April 8, 1952.

It came with less than four minutes to play and the score tied 1 - 1 in the seventh game of a semi-final playoff series. It was so packed with stark drama that Elmer Lach fainted dead away on the Montreal bench as Richard's shot flashed behind Sugar Jim Henry, himself a pain-wrecked figure with two black eyes and a broken nose.

Late in the second period the Rocket had crashed to the ice after an encounter with Boston's Leo LaBine and sprawled there, senseless, blood flowing from a deep cut over his left eye and from a reddish blot on his cheek.

"We had to carry him to the dressing room," recalls physiotherapist Bill Head. "He didn't move a muscle or flick an eyelid while Doctor Gordon Young put six stitches in his forehead and swabbed his cheek. He came around slowly, and late in the third period we sent him back to the bench, only because he insisted."

Maurice Richard sat on the bench, dazed, brooding. He looked at the clock. His eyes didn't focus and Lach, meeting his quizzical gaze told him there were four minutes to play.

"Let me out there," Richard begged the late Dick Irvin.

The Coach nodded. Rocket leaped over boards and took a pass from defenseman Butch Bouchard.

Woody Dumart of the Bruins thrust out his stick. The Montreal star bounced the rubber over the outstretched stick, swept around Dumart and regained control. Over the Boston blueline, he swung around Bob Armstrong with a characteristic burst of speed but Bill Quackenbush pinned him momentarily in a corner.

"About that time," recalls Richard, I acquired a hazy idea of what was going on. I twisted away from Quack and decided to cut out toward the front of the net. I let the puck go as I reached the middle. I heard the crowd yell. I heard the swelling roar of applause. But I was too groggy to know what happened."

In his third season there was no question about Richard's right to prime recognition. He broke records with reckless abandon, bagging 50 goals in 50 games, a mark that still stands despite expansion of the schedule to 70 games.

For six wonderful years, Maurice Richard dominated the first team.

His contemporaries will tell stories about him to their grandchildren. Like the time he straggled into the Canadiens' dressing room and said: "I'm tired out. I helped my family to move today. Carried a lot of furniture on my back."

Dick Irvin admonished him but the Rocket went out that night and scored five goals and assisted on three others in a 9 - 1 rout of the Detroit Red Wings.
