Not only was a new name added but colour combinations were revised, retaining red and white but changing white to the predominant hue, just as it remains at the present time.



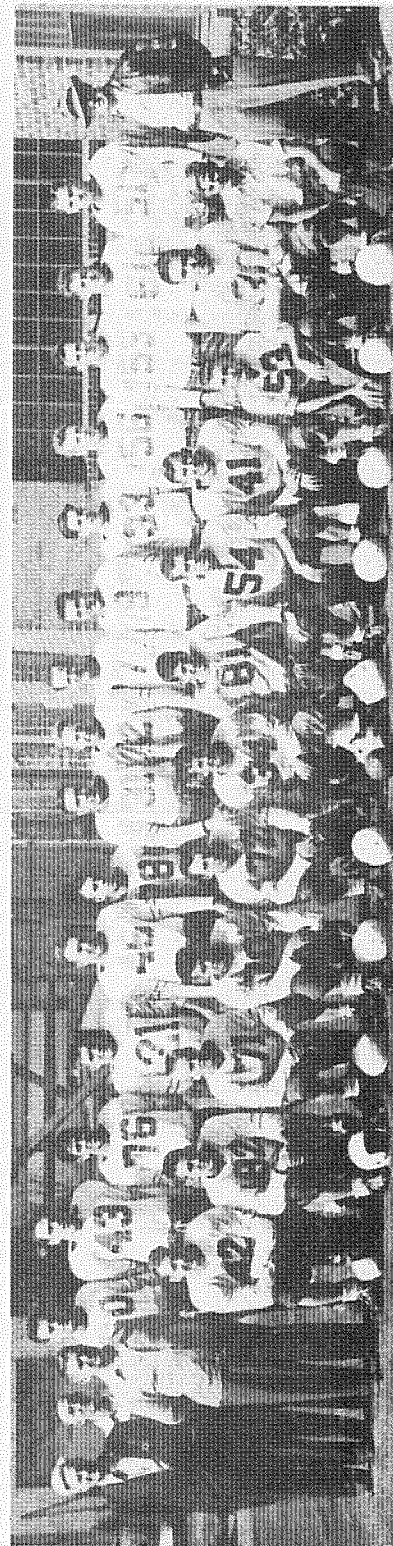

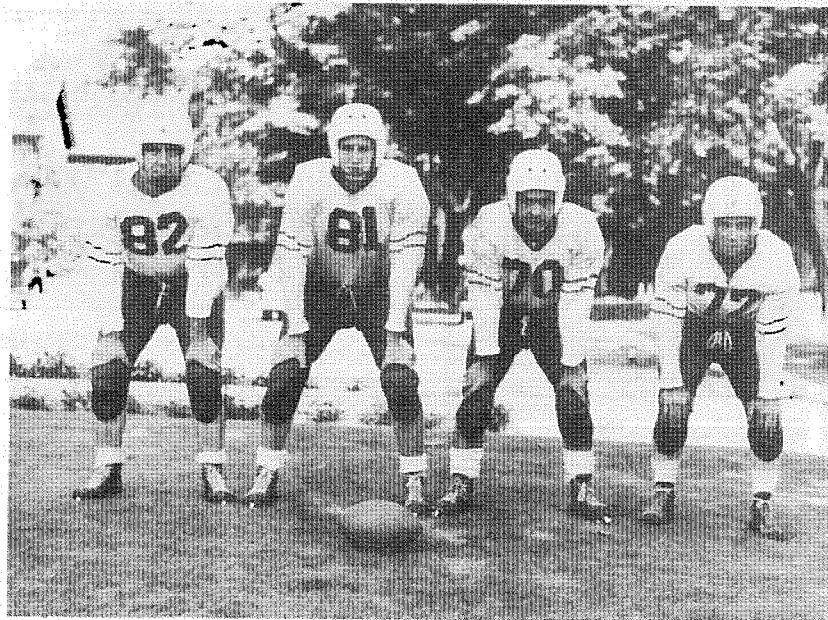

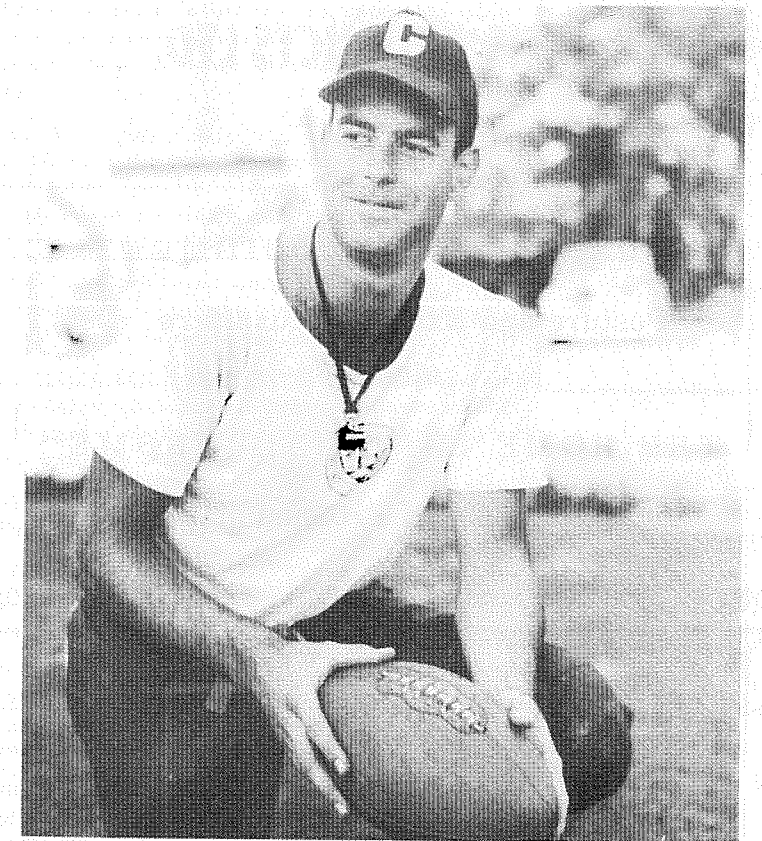

**A Summary of the
More Common Penalties**

1. **ROUGH PLAY**—Deliberately charging the ball carrier, striking or kicking an opponent, using abusive language. *Penalty: 15 yards by offending side; serious offense, disqualification and 25 yards.*
2. **OFFSIDE**—A player on either team is offside if he is ahead of the line of scrimmage when the ball is snapped. *Penalty: for team in possession of ball, loss of one down or 10 yards on the third down; for defending team, five yards.*
3. **HOLDING**—The illegal use of hands and arms. *Penalty: 10 yards, plus loss of down if incurred by team in possession of the ball.*
4. **BALL ILLEGALLY PUT INTO PLAY**—When an insufficient number of attacking players are within one yard of the line of scrimmage when the ball is put into play. *Penalty: loss of down.*
5. **OFFSIDE PASS**—A lateral pass thrown forward. *Penalty: Loss of down.*
6. **AN ILLEGALLY-THROWN FORWARD PASS**—*(See Page 12) Penalty: Loss of down.*
7. **"NO YARDS" ON A KICKED BALL**—Any player who was not behind the ball when it was kicked must be at least five yards away from an opponent who is attempting to receive the kicked ball. *Penalty to offending team: 15 yards.*
8. **ILLEGAL INTERFERENCE**—An attempt by players of the attacking team to block opponents outside of the prescribed limits — "clipping" or blocking an opponent from behind. *Penalty: Loss of down and 10 yards. (Clipping, 15 yards.)*
9. **FORWARD PASS TOUCHED OR CAUGHT BY AN INELIGIBLE RECEIVER**—*Penalty: Loss of down.*

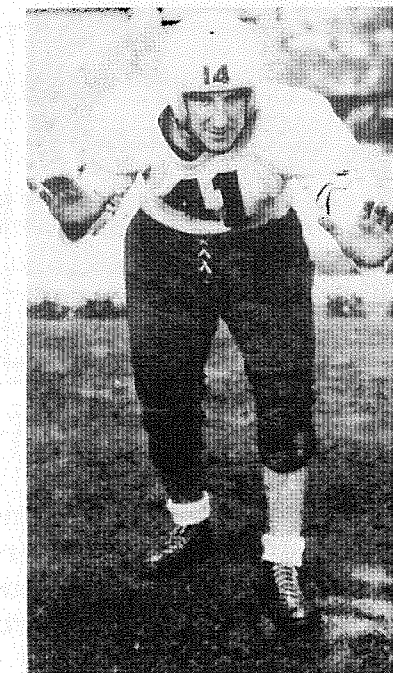

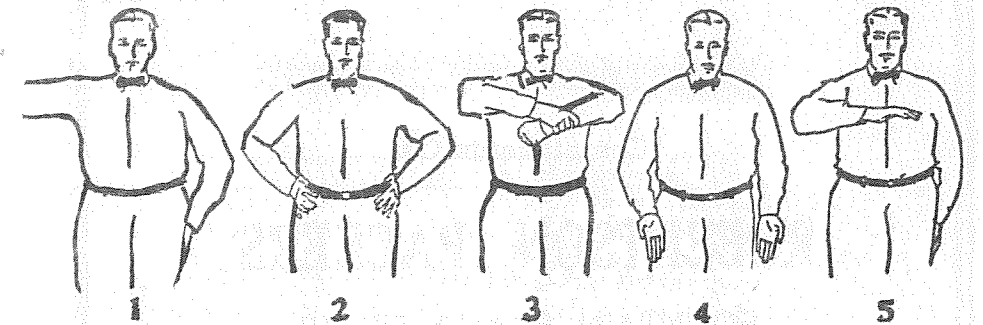

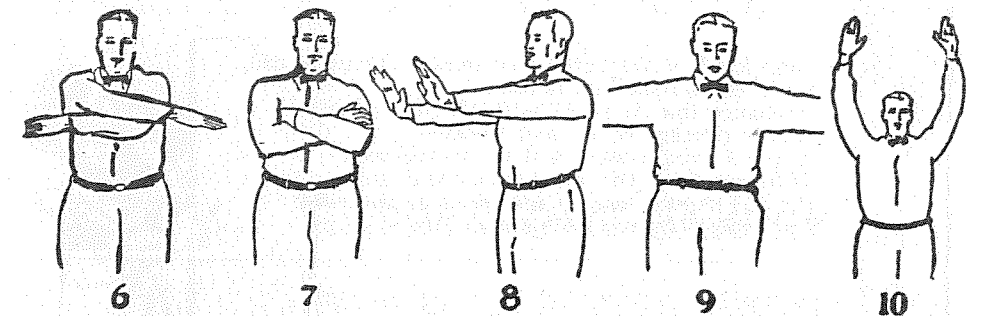

1. Either Arm Straight Out From Body—Rough Play. Arm Rotated in Circular Motion—Too long putting ball into play.
2. Hands on Hips—Offside Ball, kicked from scrimmage and before crossing line of scrimmage, strikes player of kicker's side who is "offside".
3. Grasping of One Wrist—Illegal use of Hands and Arms. Holding, etc.
4. Pushing Movement of Hands to Front with Arms Hanging Vertical—Ball illegally put in play. Player on Wingline illegally in motion when ball put in play. Insufficient number of Attacking players within one yard of the line of scrimmage when ball put in play.
5. Horizontal Arc of Either Hand—Offside pass.



6. Shifting of Hands in Horizontal Plane—An illegally thrown Forward Pass and/or one thrown with apparent intent to save loss-of-yardage.
7. Folded Arms—"No Yards" on kicked ball. Kicked ball touched by "offside" player.
8. Pushing Hands Forward from Shoulders with Hands Vertical—Illegal Interference.
9. Both Arms Straight Out from Body—Forward Pass touched or caught by Ineligible Receiver.
10. Both Arms Extended Above Head—A score. (Bringing hands together indicates a "safety-touch" score.)

WHAT ABOUT THE "T FORMATION"

Volumes have been written on the subject T formation football. However we feel that the readers of this programme in general, will not be interested in a complicated discussion of the T. What people want to know, is its difference from the system they have been watching for years. This has been either single or double wing formation or variations of these.

The T is not really a new method of attack. It was used several years ago, both in Canada and the U. S. A. However it is only quite recently that it has come into universal usage.

In single wing play the ball is delivered to the backfielder by a direct snap from centre. As the ball travels thru the air away from the line of scrimmage, not only is it visible to the opposition but it must be carried back up to the line. Both of these operations take time and tend to give the play away. This means that lines have to hold their blocks longer to keep the hole open.

When the T formation is used the ball is merely handed from the centre to the quarter who stands immediately behind him and who when he receives the ball, pivots, thus hiding the ball from the opposition at once. What a good T quarterback does with the ball from here, makes the difference. He may hand off to a player going thru the line, take a hand off and shovel pass to a back going wide, or fade back to pass.

In any case he continues to go thru the same motions even after he has given up the ball, and if the taking has been good, the defensive side will not know until too late who's got the button.

COBOURG MAYOR'S MESSAGE

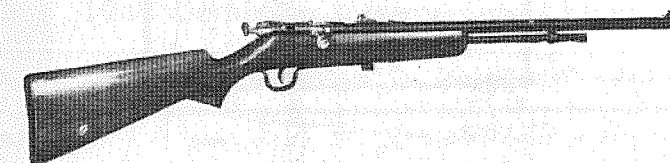
