Memorial to Dennis Guenter



On May 31, 1980, Softball Saskatchewan and the Saskatoon athletic community lost a true friend when Dennis Aron Guenter lost his life serving in his capacity as a firefighter for the City of Saskatoon. One of four softball playing brothers, Dennis, 29, was a ten year veteran of the Saskatoon Senior Men's Softball League. Two brothers, Arnold and Bruce, are still playing while a third, Robert, now pitches with Victoria Budgets and the National Softball Team.

Dennis, son of Aron and Helen Guenter, was born on January 4, 1951. His elementary school years were spent on a farm near Guenfeld Saskatchewan until 1966 when the family moved to Saskatoon. He then attended Mount Royal Collegiate and graduated in 1968. After high school he went on to attend the University of Saskatchewan for 5 years where he majored in physical education and played 5 years of varsity soccer. He was subsequently employed by MacDonald's Consolidated before taking over duties with the Saskatoon Fire Department in the fall of 1978. In May of 1975, Dennis was married to Lezlie Rieken and their union was blessed by two children Graham Aron and Sarah Lauren.

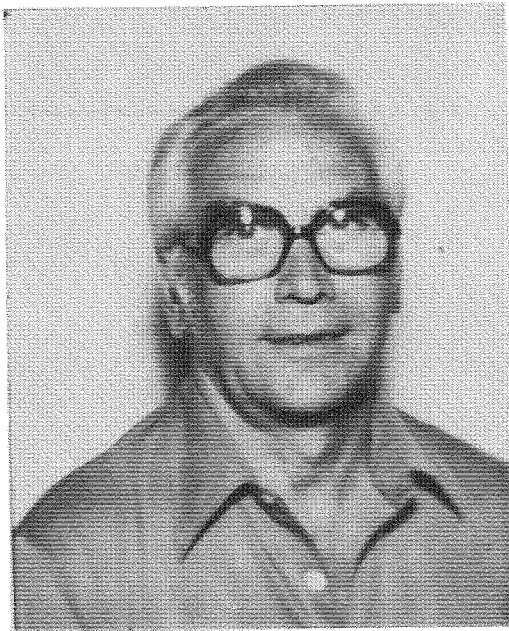
Dennis was a perennial all-star in the SSMSL as a catcher and right fielder. His ten year career saw him on the roster of 4 teams beginning in 1969 with the Warmen Gems, then to K & K Olson, All-O-Matic A's and finally this season with Arnie's Muffler. His hitting prowess and defensive abilities made him a pleasure to watch but more important than this were his qualities as a person. On the field his gentle nature, positive unselfish attitude and inner strength made Dennis a symbol of unity and a natural leader on any team. Off the field these same qualities influenced many in his varying roles of husband, father, son, brother, fellow worker and choice friend. Dennis gained the admiration and lasting respect of all he encountered and his popularity both on the field and off is a credit to his fine character.

We are proud to have as our Honorary Chairman, Mr. Bob Van Impe, President of Softball Canada, and a lifetime resident of our city.

Bob's involvement with softball began 40 years ago in the R.C.A.F. recreational program. Following his discharge in 1945, he organized a team which played in the Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association. With Bob playing and managing, this team went on to win many city championships.

At this time, he represented his team at S.A.S.A. meetings and became an executive member of the Association. This led to his representing the local association at Provincial meetings.

In 1965 the Saskatoon Senior Men's League was re-organized and Bob became its first commissioner, a position he held for 10 years.

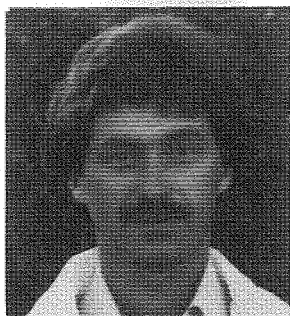
In 1966, Bob became the Commissioner of Softball from Saskatchewan to the Canadian Amateur Softball Association, a position he held until 1969. In 1969, he was elected President of the C.A.S.A. and has been re-elected every year since.

Under Bob's guidance the C.A.S.A. has expanded greatly. Over 1,000,000 people play softball in Canada at the present time, with a national registration system for players and umpires. With a national rule book, and coaching clinics being established, the game has prospered immensely under his leadership.

In 1971, Bob was elected North American, Vice-President to the International Softball Federation. In 1973, he was elected First Vice-President of the I.S.F., a position he still holds today. He is first in line for the presidency of the I.S.F.

His love of the sport at all ages and levels, has kept him busy at the helm of Softball Canada for eleven years.

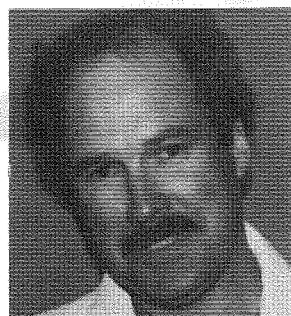
Bob is 58 years old. He is married, has three children and is employed at Labatt's Brewery as a master brewer. His main hobby . . . softball.

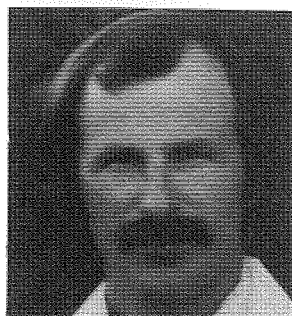

Organizing Committee

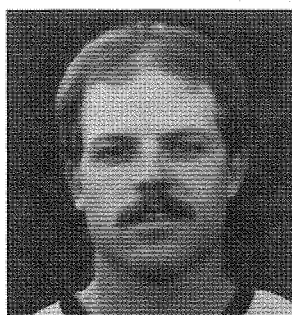

Rob Guenter



Whenever people gather to discuss softball one name is sure to enter the conversation if they are talking about top notch championship teams and players. It is Rob Guenter of Saskatoon now pitching with the powerful Budgets from Victoria, British Columbia. It was with this same Victoria team that Guenter shocked the softball world and rose to international prominence by defeating the favored United States 1-0 in 14 innings to earn the gold medal at the Pan-American Games held in July 1979 at San Juan, Puerto Rico. In the championship game Guenter was nothing short of sensational. Not only did he defeat Ty Stofflet, rated by many as the top left-handed pitcher in the world, but he pitched all 14 innings, struck out 18, and had the key hit in the bottom of the 14th which eventually led to catcher Alden Govenluck's winning run. With the victory, Canada confirmed its position as a softball powerhouse and the softball world had a new personality.

The climb to the top has been rapid and highly successful for Guenter who, at 25 years of age, is relatively young in a sport where pitchers can continue to shine into their late 30's (Stofflet turned 39 this year.) He started as a pitcher early in public school but in grade six switched to baseball where he pitched and played second base. At age 16 he returned to softball, again as a pitcher, playing in a commercial division with a junior men's team called the Saskatoon Roadrunners. His success was immediate as he led the Roadrunners to a gold medal at the Saskatchewan Summer Games. The following year as a seventeen year old, he jumped to the senior ranks joining brothers Dennis and Arnie. Once again his debut was a success as he helped lead Saskatoon K & K Olson to the 1973 Senior A Provincial Championships. Since then, the Canadian Nationals have been an annual event for Guenter except in 1977. That year he pitched for a Boston based team in the Eastern Seaboard League and led them to state and regional championships as well as an appearance in the American Softball Championships where they finished twelfth.

It was at the 1978 Canadian Championships though that he truly arrived as a pitcher of national prominence. Pitching 35 innings and allowing only 1 unearned run, Guenter led the Saskatchewan entry to a fourth place finish. For his efforts he was awarded ALL Canadian status and an invitation to Victoria for the training camp of the national team. There he quickly became a key player in their bid for the gold at Puerto Rico.

A complete athlete, Guenter has all the tools to remain at the top of the softball scene. In addition to being intensely competitive, he throws exceptionally hard but his fluid delivery allows him to continue when other pitchers have tired and left the game in favor of a fresh "arm". His 14 inning marathon against the U.S. team would bear witness to this fact. His best pitch is the rise which he mixes with a good drop, a cross-fire drop and a devastating changeup. Perhaps his strongest point though is his control. Rarely, if ever, will he walk a man which means that in order to score against him you must hit the ball. Against pitchers of this caliber that is difficult to do. With a strong team behind him, one can certainly see why he is so difficult to beat.

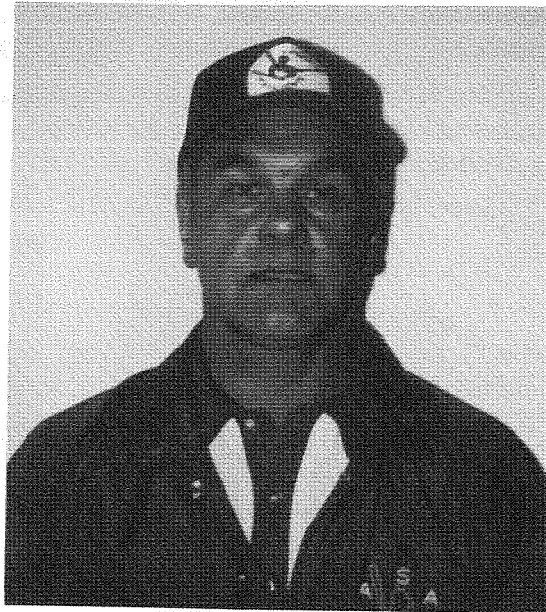
Rob's success follows him off the playing field as well. As a high school student Rob was a member of the Saskatchewan table tennis team in 1971 Canada Winter Games held here in Saskatoon. While at the University of Saskatchewan, where he earned degrees in Physical Education and Education, he was a five year member of the Husky inter-varsity soccer team. Just recently he turned his attention to basketball and joined the Saskatoon Teachers, a highly respected Senior Men's team. In a more recreational sense, Rob enjoys golfing (he scores in the mid 70's), curling, tennis and racketball.

Saskatoon and softball fans are proud of the accomplishments of this outstanding young athlete. This past winter he was named Saskatoon's **Athlete of the Year**. In addition to numerous pitching and most valuable players awards, this last is particularly gratifying since it recognizes his achievements locally, nationally and internationally.

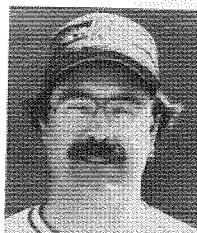


Don Funk:

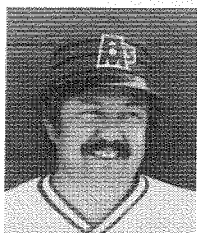


James Gattinger:

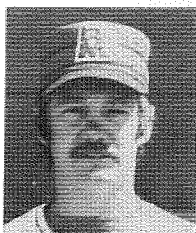


Jack Chynoweth:

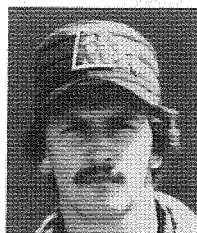


Les Howey:

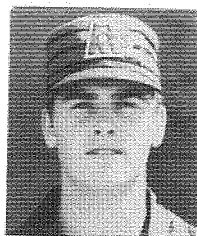
Glen Zacharias:

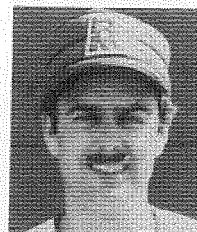
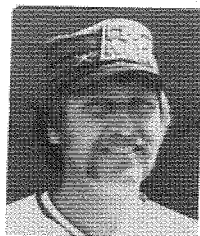


Gene McWillie:

No. 27 1st baseman, bats right, throws right. This is his 2nd year with the club. Wayne came to us via the W.M.F.L. and can provide the longball threat.

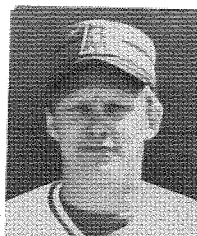


Shane Weir:

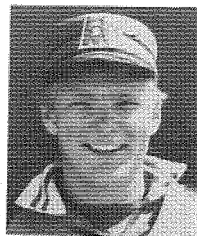


Greg Flasch:

The Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association

A Closer Look

The awarding of the 1980 Senior Men's Fast Pitch Championship to the Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association is a fitting culmination to twenty years of growth and effort on the part of the Association. The Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association is the premier softball organization in Saskatoon and a worthy recipient of the championship.

Softball has been played in the Saskatoon area since the 1920's and since that time, many different local organizations have existed to structure the game. In the early 1960's several of the local associations pooled their efforts to create the Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association. Since that time, the Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association has grown steadily to the point where it now includes eight mens' divisions and three ladies divisions. In total, more than fifty teams play in the Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association. The divisions are ranked according to competitiveness with the Senior Men's Division being the top level.

The Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association is administered by a Board of Directors and Executive Council, and these people have, over the years, been the key to the Association. Through the efforts of these individuals, the Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association has hosted dozens of provincial zone and final playoffs, coaches' clinics and social events. The previous highlights in this Association's hosting experience included the New Zealand National Ladies team in 1974 and the Canadian Junior Men's Nationals in 1975 and 1977.

Former members of the Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association administrative group have made contributions at both the national and provincial levels. Bob Van Imp, Ed Bitz, Glenn Reeve and Ed Reimer are all former Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association members, and all are still currently involved.

The late Sam Wall, former Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association President was also a Softball Saskatchewan President and involved in the formation of the Canadian Amateur Softball Association. Andy Lappas, also a former Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association President, served as Softball Saskatchewan President and also as Canadian Amateur Softball Association Treasurer. The list of individuals and achievements is far greater than space permits. Needless to say, the current administrators of the Association are as capable as any of the past as this week's presentation will attest.

Teams representing the Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association have enjoyed substantial success over the years at provincial and national competitions. The Saskatoon Imperials in 1969 and 1970 and Saskatoon Harmony Centre in 1978 have captured National Senior Ladies Championships, while the Saskatoon Imperial 400's took the National Junior Men's Championships in 1978. Saskatoon K & K Olson won the Western Canadian Senior B Men's Championship in 1979. Provincial champions from the Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association are just too numerous to mention.

The Saskatoon Amateur Softball Association considers its past achievements with a great deal of pride. It has approached its present undertaking, the 1980 Senior Men's Championship, with a great deal of respect and determination. It considers its future undertakings with a great deal of anticipation, and the expectation that they too will be well done.
