History of The Cats (1975-2001)




The Cold Springs Cats were formed in 1975 and consequently, for several years, participated in a variety of leagues which included the Peterborough City League, the Oshawa and District City League, the Eastern Ontario Fastball League and the Ontario Fastball league. During the late eighties and until the present time the team decided to play in a number of tournaments while also participating individually for different softball clubs, in the area.

The club was reunited in 1996 at the Masters' level. Eleven of the former 1980 Senior "A" Champions, who represented Ontario in the Nationals in Saskatoon, were involved in that team. The Cats' entry found success in winning Masters' O.A.S.A. Championships in 1996, 1997, and 1998.

In 1997 and 1998, besides earning provincial honours, the team won the Canadian Masters title in Cobourg and St. John N.B. respectively. Recently, during 2000 and 2001 the Cats gained bronze medals in Mitchell.

On the field activities have been only one source of satisfaction in forming the Cats' Masters team. Rekindling old acquaintances throughout Ontario and other provinces, I feel has been a greater source of satisfaction.
