OFFICIAL RULES FOR UMPIRES

(Rule 10)

Sec. 1. POWER AND DUTIES. The umpires are the representatives of the league or organization by which they have been assigned to a particular game, and as such are authorized and required to enforce each section of these rules. They have the power to order a player, coach, captain or manager to do or omit to do any act which in their judgment is necessary to give force and effect to one or all of these rules and to inflict penalties as herein prescribed. The plate umpire shall have the authority to make decisions on any situations not specifically covered in the rules.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR UMPIRES

- The umpire shall not be connected in any way with either team.
 - The umpires should be sure of the date, time, and place for the game, and should arrive at the playing field 20-30 minutes ahead of time, start the game on time and leave the field when the game is over.
 - Male umpires shall wear a powder blue shirt, long or short sleeves, and dark navy blue trousers and cap. Female umpires shall wear a powder blue blouse, long or short sleeves, and dark navy blue, full length, slacks. A cap is not required for female umpires. All other paraphernalia such as socks, belt, ball bag and jacket must also be dark navy blue for both male and female umpires. Both male and female umpires working behind the plate in Fast Pitch MUST wear a mask. It is recommended that they wear a mask behind the plate in Slow Pitch also. Female umpires working behind the plate in Fast Pitch MUST wear a body protector. It is recommended that female umpires working behind the plate in Slow Pitch also wear a body protector.
 - The umpires should introduce themselves to the captains, managers and scorer.
 - The umpires should inspect the playing field boundaries and equipment and clarify all ground rules to both teams and their coaches.
 - Each umpire shall have the power to make decisions on violations committed any time during playing time or during suspension of play until the game is over.
 - Neither umpire has the authority to set aside or question decisions made by the other within the limits of their respective duties as outlined in these rules.
 - An umpire may consult his associate at any time when requested by a captain or manager. However, the final decision shall rest with the umpire whose exclusive authority it was to make the decision and who requested the opinion of the other.
 - In order to define their respective duties, the umpire judging balls and strikes shall be designated, as the "Plate Umpire," the umpire judging base decisions as the "Base Umpire."
 - The plate umpire or base umpire shall have equal authority to:
 - Call a runner out for leaving a base too soon.
 - Call TIME for suspension of play.
 - Remove a player, coach, or manager from the game for violation of rules.
 - Call all illegal pitches.
 - The umpire shall declare the batsman or baserunner out without waiting for an appeal for such decision in all cases where such player is retired in accordance with these rules.
- Note: Unless appealed to, the umpire does not call a player out for having failed to touch base, leaving a base too soon on a fly ball, batting out of order, or making an attempt to go to second after reaching first base, as provided in these rules.
- Umpires shall not penalize a team for the infraction of a rule when imposing the penalty would be to the advantage of the offending team.

Sec. 2. THE PLATE UMPIRE:

- He shall take his position back of the catcher. He shall have full charge of and be responsible for the proper conduct of the game.
- He shall call all balls and strikes.
- He shall by agreement and in cooperation with the base umpire call plays, hit balls, fair or foul, legal or illegal caught balls. On plays which would necessitate the base umpire leaving the infield the plate umpire shall assume the duties normally required of the base umpire.
- He shall determine and declare whether:
 - A batter bunts or chops the ball.
 - A batted ball touches the person or clothing of the batter.
 - A fly ball is an infield or an outfield fly.
- He shall render base decisions as indicated in the umpire's manual.
- He shall determine when a game is forfeited.
- He shall assume all duties when assigned as a single umpire to a game.

Sec. 3. THE BASE UMPIRE:

- He shall take such positions on the playing field as outlined in the umpire's manual.
- He shall assist the plate umpire in every way to enforce the rules of the game.

Sec. 4. RESPONSIBILITIES OF A SINGLE UMPIRE. If only one umpire is assigned, his duties and jurisdiction shall extend to all points. He shall take a position in any part of the field which in his judgment will best enable him to discharge his duties.

Sec. 5. CHANGE OF UMPIRES. Umpires cannot be changed during a game by the consent of the opposing teams unless an umpire is incapacitated by injury or illness.

Sec. 6. UMPIRE'S JUDGMENT. There shall be no appeal from any decision of either umpire on the ground that he was not correct in his conclusion as to whether a batted ball was fair or foul, a baserunner safe or out, a pitched ball a strike or ball, or on any play involving accuracy of judgment, and no decision rendered by either umpire shall be reversed except that he be convinced it is in violation of one of these rules. In case the manager of either team does seek a reversal of a decision based solely on a point of rules, the umpire whose decision is in question shall, if in doubt, confer with his associate before taking any action. But under no circumstances shall any player or person other than the manager or the captain of either team have any legal right to protest on any decision and seek its reversal on a claim that it is in conflict with these rules.

Under no circumstances shall either umpire seek to reverse a decision made by his associate, nor shall either umpire criticize or interfere with the duties of his associate unless asked to do so by him.

Sec. 7. SIGNALS.

- To indicate that play shall begin or be resumed the umpire shall call "PLAY BALL" and at the same time motion the pitcher to deliver the ball.
- To indicate a strike, the umpire shall raise his right hand upward, indicate the number of strikes by the fingers, at the same time calling "STRIKE" in a clear and decisive voice, followed by calling the number of the strike.
- To indicate ball, no arm signal is used. The call is "BALL" followed by the number of the ball.
- To indicate the total count of balls and strikes, the balls are called first.
- To indicate a foul, the umpire shall call "FOUL BALL" and extend his arm horizontally away from the diamond according to the direction of the ball.
- To indicate a fair ball, the umpire shall extend his arm toward the center of the diamond using a pumping motion.
- To indicate a batter or baserunner OUT, the umpire shall raise his right hand upward above the right shoulder with fingers closed.
- To indicate that a player is SAFE, the umpire shall extend both arms diagonally in front of the body with palms toward the ground.
- To indicate suspension of play, the umpire shall call "TIME" and at the same time extend both arms above his head. The other umpire shall immediately acknowledge the suspension of play with similar action.
- A delayed dead ball will be signified by the umpire by extending his left arm horizontally.
- To indicate a TRAPPED BALL, the umpire shall extend both arms diagonally in front of the body with palms toward the ground.
- To indicate GROUND RULE DOUBLE, the umpire shall extend his right hand above his head, and indicate with two fingers, the number of bases awarded.
- To indicate HOME RUN, the umpire shall extend his right hand with closed fingers, above his head and circle arm in clock-wise movement.

Sec. 8. SUSPENSION OF PLAY.

- An umpire may suspend play when in his judgment conditions justify such action.
- Play shall be suspended whenever the plate umpire leaves his position to brush the plate or to perform other duties not directly connected with the calling of plays.
- The umpire shall suspend play whenever a batter or pitcher steps out of position for a legitimate reason.
- An umpire shall not call TIME after pitcher has started his windup.
- An umpire shall not call TIME while any play is in progress.
- In case of injury, TIME shall not be called until all plays in progress have been completed or runners have been held at their bases.
- Umpires shall not suspend play at the request of players, coaches or managers until all action in progress by either team has been completed.
- (SP Only) When in the opinion of an umpire all immediate play is apparently completed, he should call "TIME."

Sec. 9. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTY.

- Players, coaches, or managers shall not make disparaging or insulting remarks to or about opposing players, officials or spectators.
- There shall be no more than two coaches for each team to give words of assistance and direction to the members of their team while at bat. One shall be stationed near first base and one near third base, and they must remain in the coach's box.
- The penalty for violations by a player is prompt removal of the offender from the game and grounds. For the first offense, coach or manager may be warned, but for the second offense, they are removed from the game. The offender shall go directly to the dressing room for the remainder of the game or leave the grounds. Failure to do so will warrant a forfeiture of the game.

OFFICIAL RULES FOR BATTING

(Rule 7)

Sec. 1. THE BATTER SHALL TAKE HIS POSITION WITHIN THE LINES OF THE BATTER'S BOX.

- a. The batter shall not have his entire foot touching the ground completely outside the lines of the batter's box or touching home plate when the ball is hit.
- b. The batter shall not step directly across in front of the catcher to the other batter's box while the pitcher is in position ready to pitch.
- c. The batter shall not hit the ball with an illegal bat.
- EFFECT—Sec. 1 a-c: The ball is dead, the batter is out, baserunners may NOT advance.
- d. The batter shall not enter the batter's box with an altered bat.
- EFFECT—Sec. 1d: The ball is dead, the batter is out and without warning, the batter is removed from further participation in the game, and baserunners may not advance.
- e. The batter must take his position within one minute after the umpire has called "play ball."
- EFFECT—Sec. 1e: The ball is dead. The batter is out.

Sec. 2. EACH PLAYER OF THE SIDE AT BAT SHALL BECOME A BATTER IN THE ORDER IN WHICH HIS NAME APPEARS ON THE SCORESHEET.

- a. The batting order of each team must be on the scoresheet and must be delivered before the game by the manager or captain to the plate umpire. He shall submit it to the inspection of the manager or captain of the opposing team.
- EFFECT—Sec. 2a: The umpire shall declare a forfeit.
- b. The batting order delivered to the umpire must be followed throughout the game unless a player is substituted for another. When this occurs the substitute must take the place of the removed player in the batting order.
- c. The first batter in each inning shall be the batter whose name follows that of the last player who completed a turn at bat in the preceding inning.
- EFFECT—Sec. 2 b-c: Batting out of order is an appeal play which may be made by the defensive team only.
- (1) If the error is discovered while the incorrect batter is at bat, correct batter may take his place, assume any balls and strikes, and any runs scored or bases run while the incorrect batter was at bat shall be legal.
- (2) If the error is discovered after the incorrect batter has completed his turn at bat and before there has been a pitch to another batter, the player who should have batted is out. Any advance or score made because of a ball batted by the improper batter or because of the improper batter's advance to first base on a hit, an error, a base on balls, or a hit batter shall be nullified. The next batter is the player whose name follows that of the player called out for failing to bat. If the batter declared out under these circumstances is the third out, the correct batter in the next inning shall be the player who would have come to bat had the players been put out by ordinary play.
- (3) The error if discovered after the first pitch to the next batter, the turn at bat of the incorrect batter is legal, all runs scored and bases run are legal, and the next batter in order shall be the one whose name follows that of the incorrect batter. No one is called out for failure to bat. Players who have not batted and who have not been called out have lost their turn at bat until reached again in the regular order.
- (4) No baserunner shall be removed from the base he is occupying to bat in his proper place. He merely misses his turn at bat with no penalty. The batter following him in the batting order becomes the legal batter.
- d. When the third out in an inning is made before the batter has completed his turn at bat, he shall be the first batter in the next inning, and the ball and strike count on him shall be cancelled.

Sec. 3. THE BATTER SHALL NOT HINDER THE CATCHER FROM FIELDING OR THROWING THE BALL BY STEPPING OUT OF THE BATTER'S BOX, OR INTENTIONALLY HINDER THE CATCHER WHILE STANDING WITHIN THE BATTER'S BOX.

- EFFECT—Sec. 3: The ball is dead and baserunners must return to the last base that in the judgment of the umpire was touched at the time of the interference. The batter is out except:
- (1) (FP only) If a baserunner attempting to steal is put out, the batter is not also out.
- (2) With less than two outs and a runner on third base and the batter interferes with a play being made at home plate, the batter is not out because the runner is out.

Sec. 4. MEMBERS OF THE TEAM AT BAT SHALL NOT INTERFERE WITH A PLAYER ATTEMPTING TO FIELD A FOUL FLY BALL.

- EFFECT—Sec. 4—The ball is dead and the batter is out, and baserunners must return to the base legally held at the time of the pitch.

Sec. 5. THE BATTER SHALL NOT HIT A FAIR BALL WITH THE BAT A SECOND TIME IN FAIR TERRITORY.

- Note: If the batter drops the bat and the ball rolls against the bat in fair territory and, in the umpire's judgment, there was no intention to interfere with the course of the ball, the batter is not out and the ball is alive and in play.
- EFFECT—Sec. 5—The ball is dead, the batter is out, and baserunners may not advance.

Sec. 6. A STRIKE IS CALLED BY THE UMPIRE:

- a. (Fast Pitch) For each legally pitched ball entering the strike zone before touching the ground and at which the batter does not swing.
- b. (Fast Pitch) For each legally pitched ball struck at and missed by the batter.
- EFFECT—Sec. 6a-b (FP) The ball is in play and the baserunners may advance with liability to be put out. The batter is out if:
- (1) The catcher does not drop the third strike.
- (2) First base is occupied with less than two out.
- a. (Slow Pitch) For each legally pitched ball entering the strike zone before touching the ground and at which the batter does not swing. It is not a strike if the pitched ball touches home plate and is not swung at.
- b. (Slow Pitch) For each pitched ball struck at and missed by the batter.
- EFFECT—Sec. 6a-b (SP) The ball is dead.
- c. For each foul tip held by the catcher.
- EFFECT—Sec. 6c (Fast Pitch) The ball is in play and baserunners may advance with liability to be put out. The batter is out if it is the third strike.
- EFFECT—Sec. 6c (Slow Pitch) The batter is out if it is the third strike. The ball is dead on any strike.
- d. For each foul ball not legally caught on the fly when the batter has less than two strikes.
- e. For each pitched ball struck at and missed which touches any part of the batter.
- f. When any part of the batter's person is hit with his own batted ball when he is in the batter's box.
- g. A delivered ball by the pitcher that hits the batsman in the strike zone.
- EFFECT—Sec. 6 d-g: The ball is dead and baserunners must return to their bases without liability to be put out.

Sec. 7. A BALL IS CALLED BY THE UMPIRE:

- a. For each pitched ball which does not enter the strike zone or touches the ground before reaching home plate or touches home plate and which is not struck at by the batter.
- EFFECT—Sec. 7a (Fast Pitch) The ball is in play and baserunners are entitled to advance with liability to be put out.
- EFFECT—Sec. 7a (Slow Pitch) The ball is dead. Baserunners may not advance.
- b. For each illegally pitched ball.
- EFFECT—Sec. 7b (Fast Pitch) The ball is dead and baserunners are entitled to advance one base without liability to be put out.
- EFFECT—Sec. 7b (Slow Pitch) The ball is dead. Baserunners may not advance.
- c. (SP Only) When a delivered ball by the pitcher hits the batsman outside of strike zone.
- EFFECT—Sec. 7c: The ball is dead. Baserunners may not advance.

Sec. 8. A FAIR BALL IS A LEGALLY BATTED BALL WHICH:

- a. Settles or is touched on fair ground between home and first base or between home and third base.
- b. Bounds past first or third base on or over fair ground.
- c. Touches first, second, or third base.
- d. While on or over fair ground touches the person or clothing of an umpire or player.
- e. First falls on fair ground beyond first or third base. A fair fly must be judged according to the relative position of the ball and the foul line regardless of whether the fielder is on fair or foul ground at the time he touches the ball.
- EFFECT—Sec. 8 a-e: The ball is in play and baserunners are entitled to advance a number of bases with liability to be put out. The batter becomes a baserunner unless the infield fly rule applies.
- f. While on or over fair ground, lands behind a fence or into a stand a distance of more than 225 feet (Male & Female Fast Pitch), 250 feet (Female Slow Pitch) or 275 feet (Male Slow Pitch) from home plate. This is considered a home run. If the distance is less than 225 feet (Male & Female Fast Pitch), or 250 feet (Female Slow Pitch) or 275 feet (Male Slow Pitch) from home plate, it is a two base hit.
- g. Hits a foul line pole on the fly. If the ball hits the pole above the fence level, it shall be a home run.

Sec. 9. A FOUL BALL IS A LEGALLY BATTED BALL WHICH:

- a. Settles on foul ground between home and first base or between home and third base.
- b. Bounds past first or third base on or over foul ground.
- c. First touches on foul ground beyond first or third base.
- d. While on or over foul ground touches the person or clothing of an umpire, player, or is blocked.
- EFFECT—Sec. 9 a-d: (1) The ball is dead unless it is a legally caught foul fly. If a foul fly is caught the batter is out. (2) A strike is called on the batter unless he already had two strikes. (3) Baserunners must return to their bases without liability to be put out unless a foul fly is caught. In this case, the baserunner may advance with liability to be put out after the ball has been touched.

Sec. 10. A FOUL TIP IS A BATTED BALL WHICH GOES DIRECTLY FROM THE BAT, NOT HIGHER THAN THE BATTER'S HEAD, TO THE CATCHER'S HANDS AND IS LEGALLY CAUGHT BY THE CATCHER.

- Note: It is not a foul tip unless caught and any foul tip that is caught is a strike.
- In Fast Pitch, the ball is in play, in Slow Pitch, the ball is dead.
- EFFECT—Sec. 10 (Fast Pitch)—A strike is called, the ball remains in play and baserunners may advance with liability to be put out.
- EFFECT—Sec. 10 (Slow Pitch)—A strike is called, the ball is dead.

Sec. 11. THE BATTER IS OUT UNDER THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES:

- a. When the third strike is struck at and missed and touches any part of the batter's person.
- b. When a batter appears in the batter's box with, or is discovered using an altered bat.
- c. When a fly ball is legally caught.
- d. Immediately when he hits an infield fly with baserunners on first and second or on first, second and third with less than two out. This is called the infield fly rule.
- e. Batter is out if fielder intentionally drops a fair fly or line drive with first, first and second, first and third, or first, second and third occupied before two are out. Runners need not retouch and may advance at their own risk.
- Note: A trapped ball shall not be considered as having been intentionally dropped.
- f. The Batter-runner is out if a preceding runner shall, in the umpire's judgment, intentionally interfere with a fielder who is attempting to catch a thrown ball or to throw a ball in an attempt to complete the play. The runner shall also be called out and interference called.
- g. (FP Only) When the third strike is caught by the catcher.
- h. (FP Only) When he has three strikes if there are less than two outs and first base is occupied.
- i. (FP Only) When he bunts foul after the second strike.
- j. (SP Only) When a third strike is called.
- k. (SP Only) When he bunts or chops the ball downward.

Sec. 12. THE BATTER IS NOT OUT IF A FIELDER MAKING A PLAY ON HIM USES AN ILLEGAL GLOVE.

The manager of the offended team has the option of having the batter bat over and assuming the ball and strike count he had prior to the pitch he hit; or taking the result of the play.

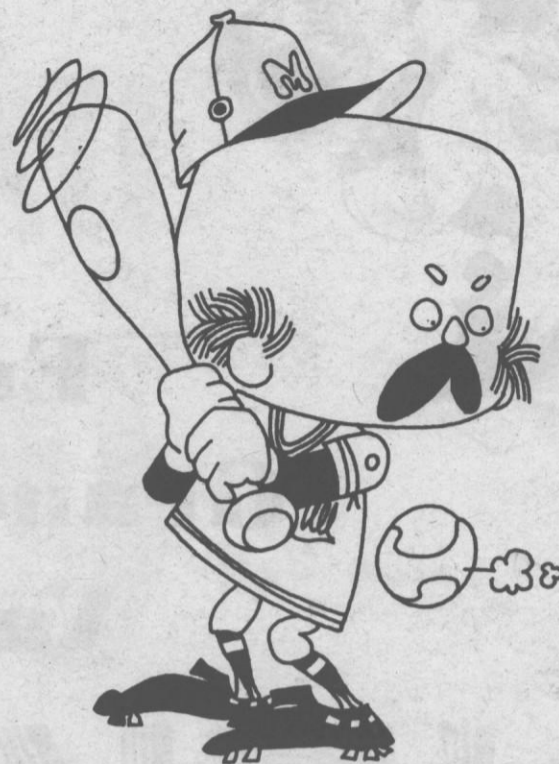

OFFICIAL RULES FOR PITCHING

(Rule 6)



Sec. 1. THE PITCHER SHALL TAKE A POSITION WITH BOTH FEET FIRMLY ON THE GROUND AND IN CONTACT WITH, BUT NOT OFF THE SIDE OF, THE PITCHER'S PLATE.

- Preliminary to pitching, the pitcher must come to a full and complete stop facing the batter with both shoulders in line with first and third base, and with the ball held in both hands in front of the body.
- This position must be maintained at least one second and not more than 20 seconds before taking one hand off the ball to start the delivery.
- The pitcher shall not be considered in pitching position unless the catcher is in position to receive the pitch.
- The pitcher may not take the pitching position on or near the pitcher's plate without having the ball in his possession.

Sec. 2. THE PITCH starts when one hand is taken off the ball or the pitcher makes any motion that is part of his wind-up. In the act of delivering the ball, the pitcher shall not take more than one step which must be forward, toward the batter, and simultaneous with the delivery of the ball to the batter. The pivot foot must remain in contact with the pitcher's plate until the ball has been released.

Sec. 3. A LEGAL DELIVERY SHALL BE A BALL WHICH IS DELIVERED TO THE BATTER WITH AN UNDERHAND MOTION.

- The release of the ball and the follow through of the hand and wrist must be forward past the straight line of the body.
- The hand shall be below the hip and the wrist not farther from the body than the elbow.
- The pitch is completed with a step toward the batter.
- The catcher must be within the outside lines of the catcher's box when the pitch is released.
- The catcher shall return the ball directly to the pitcher after each pitch except after a strike out, or putout made by the catcher. The pitcher has twenty seconds to release the next pitch.

EXCEPTION—Sec. 3c: Does not apply with runners on base.

EFFECT—Sec. 3c: An additional "ball" is awarded the batter.

Sec. 4. THE PITCHER MAY USE ANY WIND-UP DESIRED PROVIDING:

- He does not make any motion to pitch without immediately delivering the ball to the batter.
- He does not use a rocker action in which, after having the ball in both hands in pitching position, he removes one hand from the ball, takes a backward and forward swing and returns the ball to both hands in front of the body.
- He does not use a wind-up in which there is a stop or reversal of the forward motion.
- He does not make more than one revolution of the arm in the windmill pitch. A pitcher may drop his arm to the side and to the rear before starting the windmill motion.
- He does not continue to wind-up after taking the forward step which is simultaneous with the release of the ball.

Sec. 5. THE PITCHER SHALL NOT DELIBERATELY DROP, ROLL, OR BOUNCE THE BALL WHILE IN PITCHING POSITION IN ORDER TO PREVENT THE BATTER FROM STRIKING IT.

Sec. 6. THE PITCHER SHALL NOT AT ANY TIME DURING THE GAME BE ALLOWED TO USE TAPE OR OTHER SUBSTANCE UPON THE BALL, THE PITCHING HAND OR FINGERS. Under the supervision and control of the umpire powdered resin may be used to dry the hands. The pitcher shall not wear a sweatband, bracelet, or similar type item on the wrist or forearm of the pitching arm.

EFFECT—Sec. 1-6: Any infraction of Sections 1 thru 6 is an illegal pitch with the exception of Section 3c which is covered separately. The ball is dead. A ball is called on the batter. Baserunners are entitled to advance one base without liability to be put out. Exception— if the pitcher completes the delivery of the ball to the batter and the batsman hits the ball and reaches first base safely and all baserunners advance at least one base then the play stands and the illegal pitch is nullified. A delayed dead ball will be signified by the umpire by extending his left arm horizontally.

Note: An illegal pitch shall be called immediately when it becomes illegal. If called by the plate umpire, it shall be called in a voice so that the catcher and the batter will hear it. The plate umpire will also give the delayed dead ball signal. If called by the base umpire, it shall be called so that the nearest fielder shall hear it. The base umpire shall also give the delayed dead ball signal. Failure of players to hear the call shall not void the call.

Sec. 7. NO PITCH SHALL BE DECLARED WHEN:

- The pitcher pitches during the suspension of play.
- The pitcher attempts a quick return of the ball before the batter has taken position or is off balance as a result of a previous pitch.
- The runner is called out for leaving the base too soon.
- The pitcher pitches before a baserunner has retouched his base after a foul ball has been declared and the ball is dead.

EFFECT—Sec. 7 a-d: The ball is dead and all subsequent action on that pitch is cancelled.

Sec. 8. AT THE BEGINNING OF EACH INNING OR WHEN A PITCHER RELIEVES ANOTHER, NO MORE THAN ONE MINUTE MAY BE USED TO DELIVER NO MORE THAN FIVE BALLS TO THE CATCHER OR OTHER TEAMMATE. Play shall be suspended during this time. For excessive warm-up pitches a pitcher shall be penalized by awarding a ball to the batter for each pitch in excess of five.

Sec. 9. IF THE BALL SLIPS FROM THE PITCHER'S HAND DURING HIS WINDUP OR DURING THE BACKSWING, THE BALL WILL BE IN PLAY AND THE RUNNERS MAY ADVANCE AT THEIR OWN RISK.

Sec. 10. THE PITCHER SHALL NOT THROW TO A BASE WHILE HIS FOOT IS IN CONTACT WITH THE PITCHER'S PLATE AFTER HE HAS TAKEN THE PITCHING POSITION.

EFFECT—Sec. 10: Illegal pitch, the ball is dead, a ball is called on the batter and all runners advance one base. If the throw from the pitcher's plate is during an appeal play, the appeal is cancelled.

Note: The pitcher can remove himself from the pitching position by stepping backwards off the pitcher's plate. Stepping forward constitutes an illegal pitch.

Sec. 11. THERE SHALL BE ONLY ONE CONFERENCE BETWEEN THE MANAGER OR OTHER TEAM REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE DUGOUT WITH EACH AND EVERY PITCHER IN AN INNING. The second conference shall result in the removal of the pitcher from the pitching position for the remainder of the game.

Sec. 12. NO PLAYER, MANAGER OR COACH SHALL CALL "TIME" OR EMPLOY ANY OTHER WORD OR PHRASE OR COMMIT ANY ACT WHILE THE BALL IS ALIVE AND IN PLAY FOR THE OBVIOUS PURPOSE OF TRYING TO MAKE THE PITCHER COMMIT AN ILLEGAL PITCH.

EFFECT—Sec. 12: No pitch shall be declared and a warning issued to the offending team. A repeat of this type act by the team warned shall result in the offender being removed from the game.

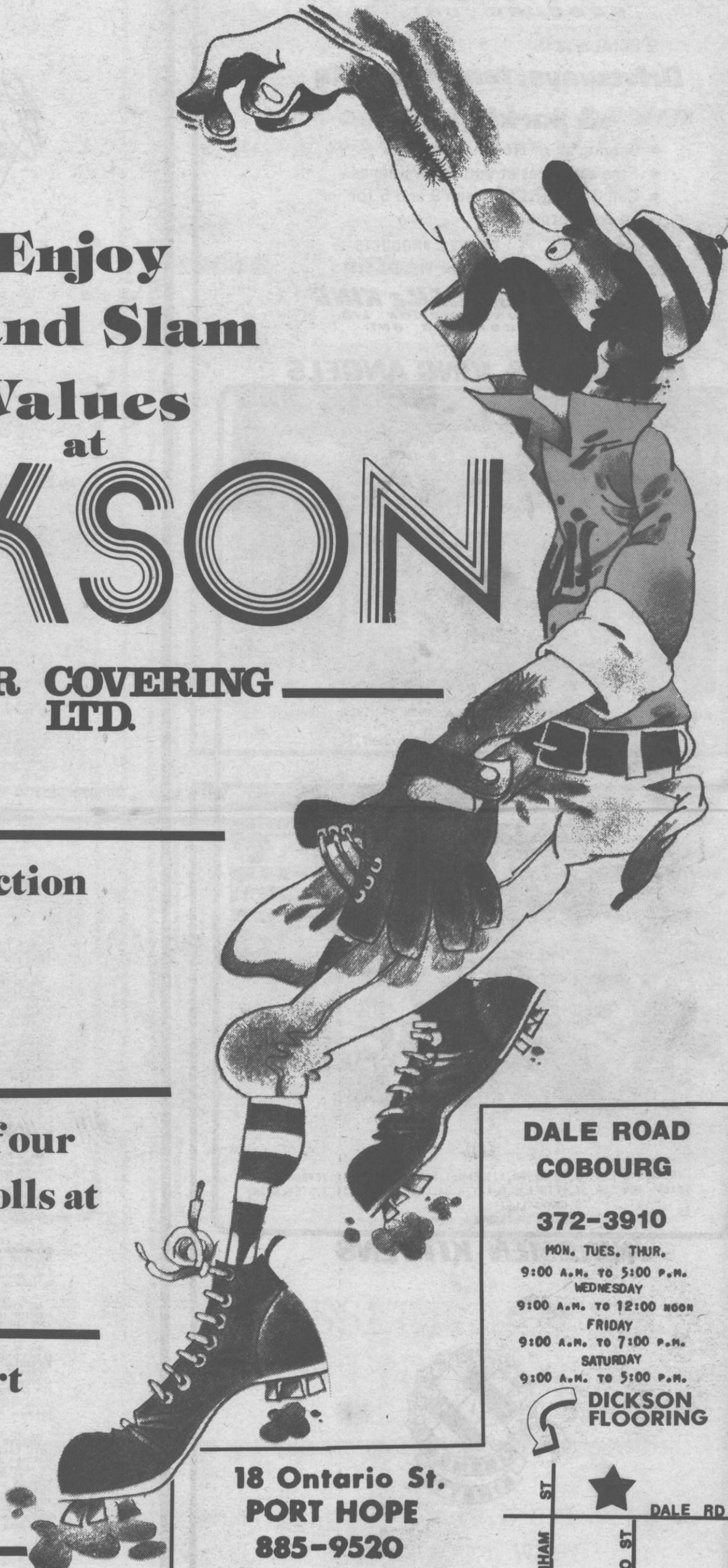
