



Leo has always dedicated his time and passion for supporting others in the community as a member of Port Hope Optimist Club, President of the Port Hope Optimist Baseball Association, the Terry Fox Run, and coaching wrestling, hockey and baseball.

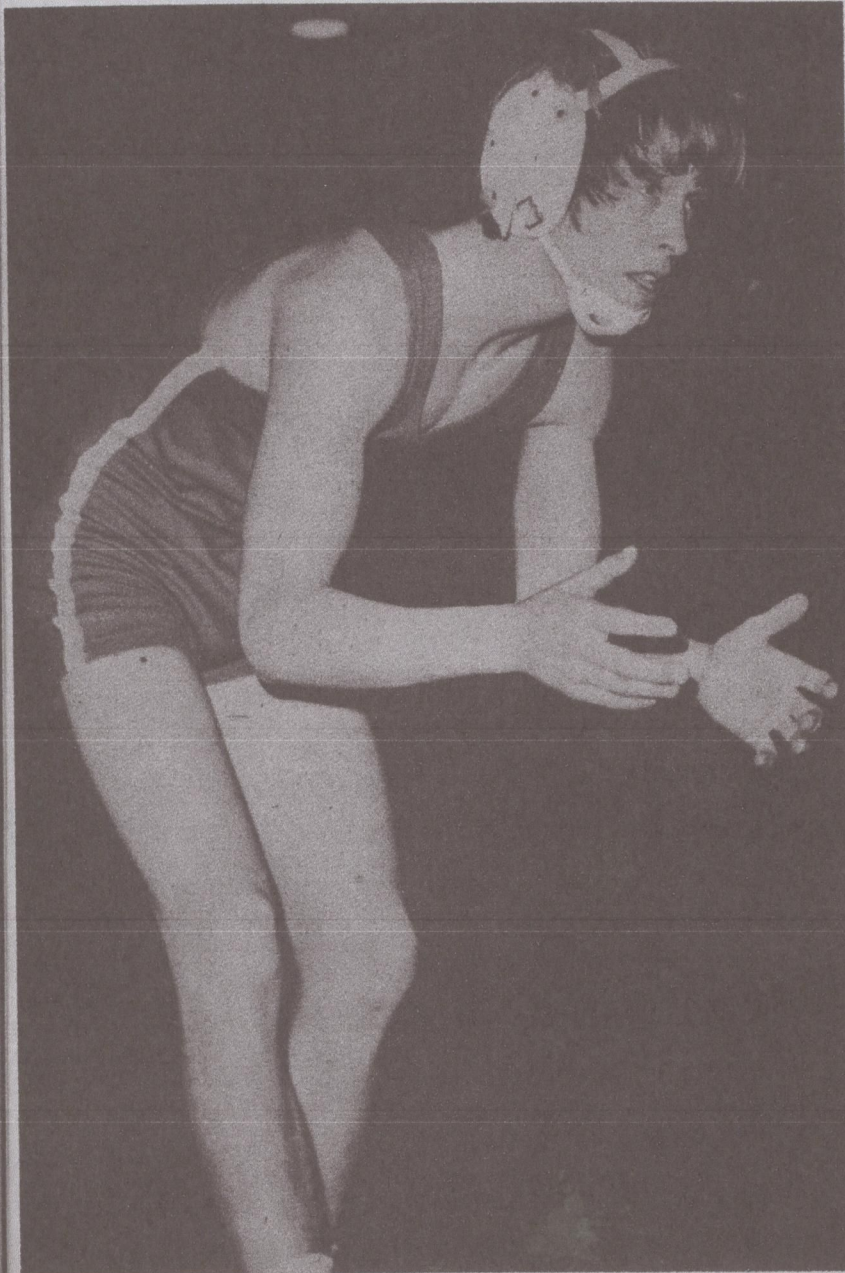
As a member of the Port Hope Optimist Club (~1990 – 2004) he would support local community events including building baseball diamonds, bike rodeos, and leading the Baseball Association. As the President of the Baseball Association for 10 years, he led the league for 600-800 registered children. This included all the registration, coaching staff and team selection, umpires, equipment, schedules and year end tournaments.

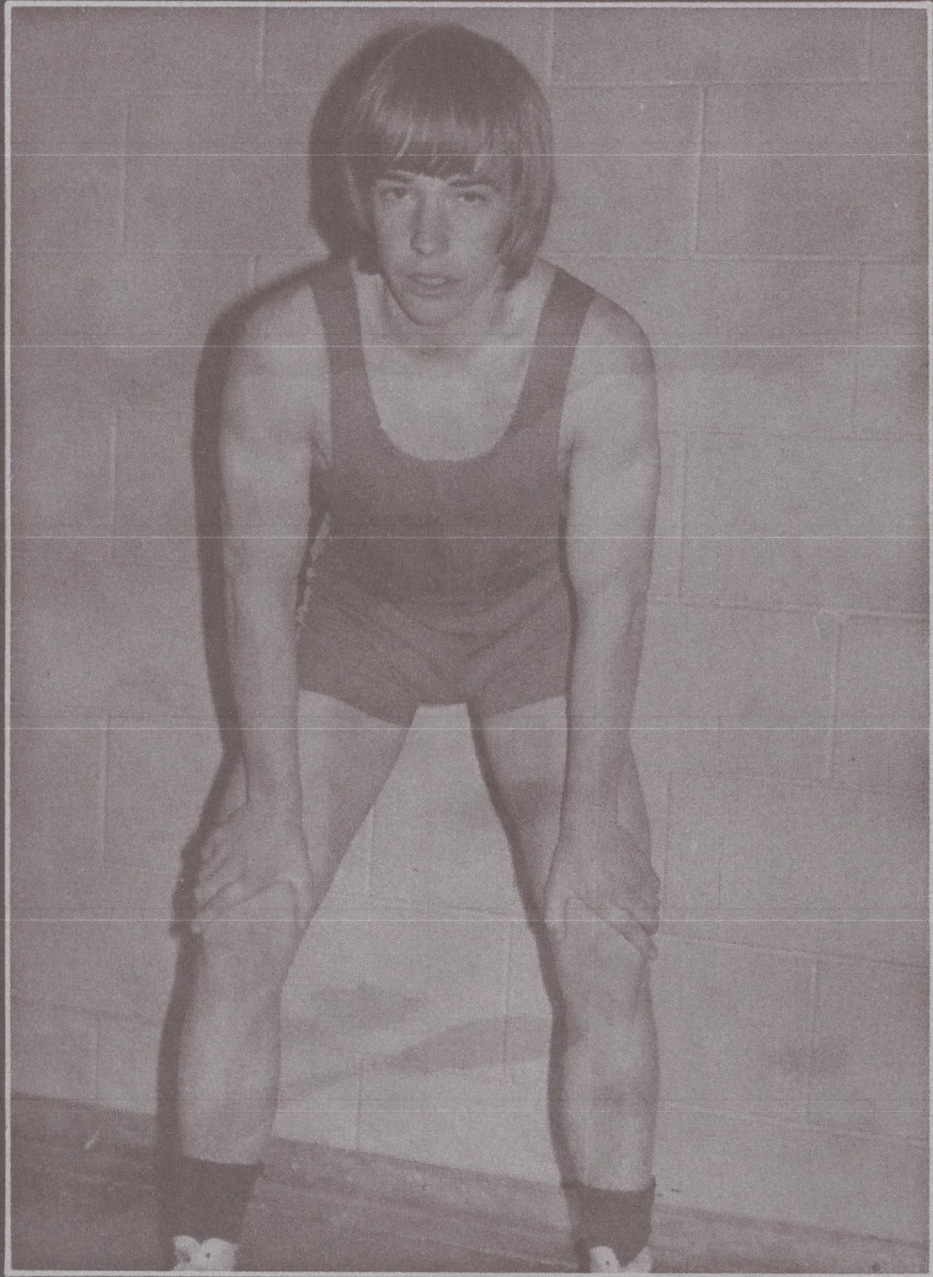

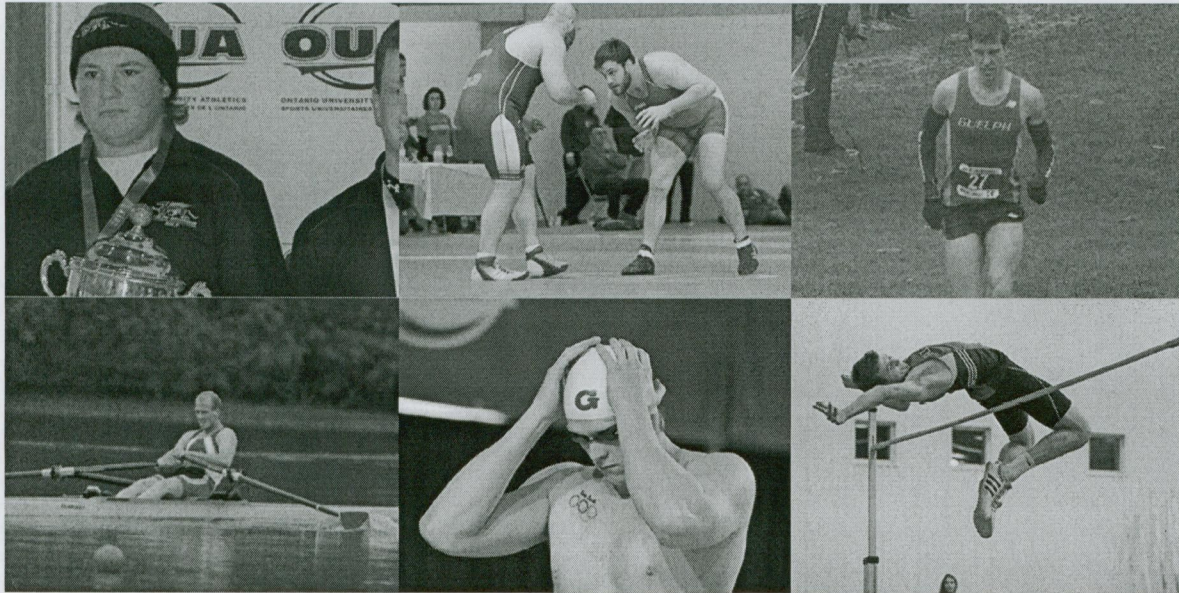

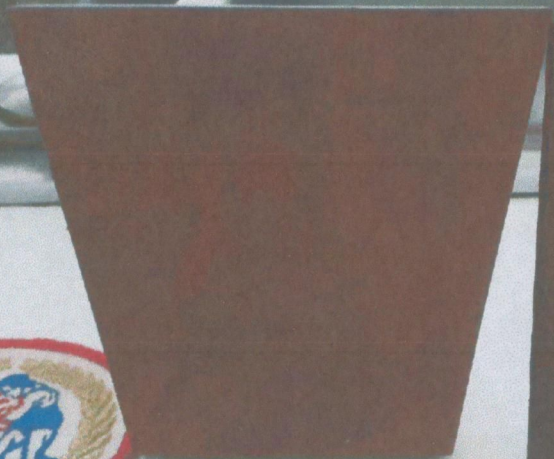

Reyns, vanderHeyden earn Thunder Bay trip in regional mat meet

Leo Reyns and Servaas vanderHeyden of the CDCI East wrestling team excelled in their respective weight classes in a regional open qualifying meet at Newtonbrook Secondary School in Willowdale on Saturday.

The tournament served as the first step leading to the Canadian junior wrestling championships

to be held in Alberta in mid-February of 1975.

Reyns and vanderHeyden both finished first in the regional meet to earn an expenses-paid trip to Thunder Bay December 29-30 where Ontario's representatives in the Canadians will be decided.

Competing in the 123.5 pound division, Reyns tied for first place at

Willowdale with West Hill's Stitt, an all-Ontario high school champion the past four years.

Servaas vanderHeyden had to win only one 191½-pound match to clean up in his weight classification

Several other members of the East Collegiate team also entered the regional meet.

Ross McKendrick, for instance, placed fourth in the 105½-pound bracket while Dirk Varo came fifth in the 154-pound division, Glen Campbell and Andy Graham fifth and sixth respectively in the 114½-pound section.

Also taking part were Scott McKinlay and Villi vanderHeyden (123½), Brian Cotterill (143) and Angelo Didomizio (178½).

The performances of the Cobourg East wrestlers auger well for the upcoming Kawartha season. The CDCI East club has won the district title the last four years in a row. It's also the defending COSSA champion.

All of last season's first stringers are back again with the exceptions of Mike Boyle and Terry Curtis.

Newcomer Bob Richards is assisting Rodger Harp with the coaching this season. He was a fine wrestler in his own right when he attended Pickering High School and Guelph University.

About 40 boys are working out with the CDCI East team. First acid test for some of them will come November 30 in an invitational tournament in Cobourg. COSSA schools have been invited to enter wrestlers in the competition.

The local grapplers also are looking forward to the Belleville Firefighters Invitational Tournament on December 15.
